TUAM, VICAR STREET TO GAA SPORTS GROUNDS ON THE R332 DUBLIN ROAD, ACTIVE TRAVEL SCHEME

Non-Statutory Public Consultation Report
November 2025

1. Introduction

Galway County Council (GCC) has appointed Systra to develop an active travel scheme along the Dublin Road in Tuam, from Vicar Street in the west to the Tuam Stars GAA sports grounds in the east. The active travel scheme, funded by the National Transport Authority (NTA), is being developed in line with the NTA's Project Appraisal Guidelines (PAG). The project is currently in Phase 3 Preliminary Design stage.

Due to the level of interest in the community relating to this project, and its' interface with six schools in the locality, a decision was taken by GCC to undertake a non-statutory public consultation (NSPC). The consultation consisted of a virtual consultation on www.consult.galway.ie, where the drawings showing the emerging preferred route and information leaflet were shared with the public.

This report provides a summary of the consultation process, submissions received and actions which will be taken to address the concerns raised.

2. Consultation Details

The consultation was advertised in the local newspaper, The Tuam Herald, the Tuam Library, shared on social media and cascaded through the local school's communication channels. The consultation ran from 17th October to 31st October 2025.

A total of 21 submissions were received during the consultation period.

3. Summary of Submissions

Key themes raised in the submissions are:

- **Design matters**
Submissions looked to review the location of the proposed pedestrian crossing near Vicar Street and the corner radii to accommodate turning vehicles, improve safety of the footway for pedestrians waiting to cross while vehicles turned into Circular Road, create a set down area dedicated to traffic that can be easily accessed by parents dropping off children to school, include taxi rank, use only zebra crossings along the new route rather than traffic lights, dedicated bus set down for schools, engage with schools to widen access off-road for both drop-offs and collections.
- **Extend the active travel scheme to the NCT Centre on Dublin Road to connect to the recently upgraded footway**
Many submissions requested that the active travel scheme does not terminate at the Tuam Stars GAA sports ground and that the active travel scheme should continue east along the route to improve the connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists to the recently completed footpath works at the NCT centre. The submissions also reinforced the message that many children in the locality also use the Tuam Rugby sports grounds which is further east than the GAA sports ground. These submissions also sought for a safe crossing location near the Tuam Rugby sports grounds to be included in the project.
- **Vehicle speeds**
Submissions sought for traffic calming measures to be included in the project along the Dublin Road due to very high vehicular speeds currently being experienced. One submission sought for the speed limit to be reduced to 30kph.

- **Pedestrian crossings**
Submissions sought additional pedestrian crossings to be included in the project, with particular emphasis on a safe crossing location near Tuam Rugby sports grounds, linking to Glass Avenue (which is used regularly as a walking route by local people) to be included in the project.
- **Stakeholder Engagement**
Submissions sought for GCC to liaise directly with all residents and businesses to ensure that they are up to speed with works and engage with those who use parking permits so they won't lose dedicated parking near their homes.

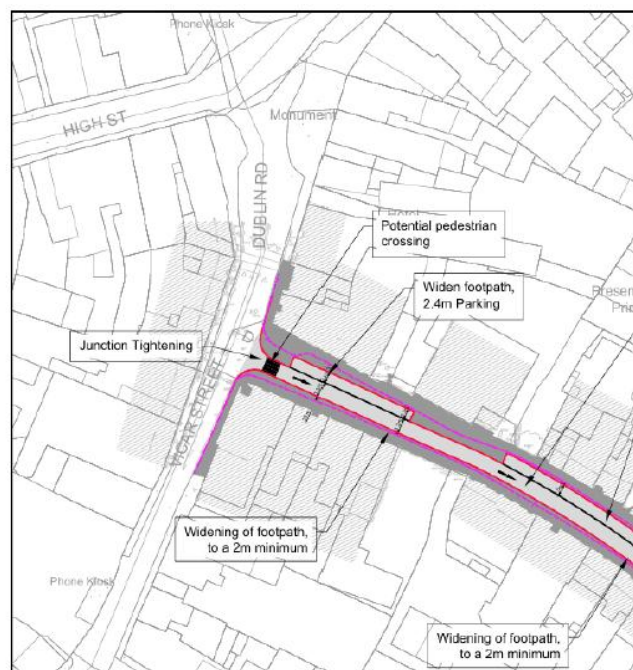

Tuam MD wish to make a submission on the above scheme.

The Dublin Road Active Travel Scheme in Tuam is currently undergoing non-statutory public consultation via the Galway County Council's consultation portal. The scheme presently extends from Vicar Street to the Tuam Stars GAA Sports Grounds on the R332 Dublin Road.

Why Consider Extending Beyond Tuam Stars to Tuam Rugby Club?

The current proposal includes:

- A two-way segregated cycleway
- Improved footways and crossings
- A school zone enhancement
- Junction geometry reductions for safety [consult.galway.ie]

However, the Tuam Rugby Club, located just beyond the current southern extent, is a major community and youth sports facility. Extending the scheme to this point would:

- Improve safe access for cyclists and pedestrians, especially children and families.
- Complete the connectivity between key sports and recreational hubs.
- Support sustainable travel to more destinations, aligning with Active Travel goals.
- Avoid a disjointed endpoint, which could reduce the effectiveness and uptake of the infrastructure.

Extending the Dublin Road Active Travel scheme in Tuam beyond the Tuam Stars entrance to the Tuam Rugby Club entrance could be justified for several strategic, safety, and community reasons. Here are some key considerations:

1. Connectivity and Access

- **Tuam Rugby Club** is a significant community facility that attracts regular traffic, especially during training and match days. Extending the scheme improves **safe access for pedestrians and cyclists**.
- It would also **connect more residential areas** and amenities, encouraging active travel for a wider population.

2. Safety Improvements

- The stretch between Tuam Stars and Tuam Rugby Club may currently lack adequate pedestrian or cycle infrastructure. Extending the scheme would:
 - Reduce **conflicts between vehicles and vulnerable road users**.
 - Improve **visibility and crossing points**, especially for children and families attending sports events.

3. Strategic Planning Alignment

- The extension could align with **Active Travel and Climate Action goals**, promoting sustainable transport.
- It may also support **future development plans** for Tuam, especially if there are housing or recreational expansions in that corridor.

4. Equity and Inclusion

- Ensuring that facilities like Tuam Rugby Club are accessible by foot or bike promotes **inclusive access**, especially for those without cars.

- It supports **youth engagement** in sports and recreation by making travel safer and more independent.

5. Cost Efficiency and Continuity

- If the current scheme already mobilizes resources and contractors, extending it slightly could be **cost-effective** compared to initiating a separate future phase.
- It avoids creating a **disconnected or abrupt end** to the infrastructure, which can reduce usability and impact.

A pedestrian crossing from the Tuam Rugby Club side of the Dublin Road to the Glass Avenue walking route would be highly beneficial for several reasons:

1. Safe Access to Recreational Routes

- **Glass Avenue** is a popular walking route, possibly used for leisure, exercise, or commuting.
- Without a formal crossing, pedestrians—especially children and older adults—may be forced to cross at unsafe locations on a busy regional road.

2. Linking Community Amenities

- The Rugby Club and Glass Avenue are both community assets. A crossing would:
 - **Connect sports and recreational facilities**
 - Encourage **active travel between destinations**, reducing car dependency

3. Traffic Calming and Visibility

- A designated crossing (e.g. zebra or signalised) would:
 - **Slow down traffic** approaching the town
 - Improve **driver awareness** of pedestrian activity in the area

4. School and Youth Safety

- If children or youth use this route to access schools, sports, or homes, a crossing ensures:
 - **Safer independent travel**
 - **Reduced risk of accidents**, especially during peak hours or winter evenings

5. Planning and Accessibility Compliance

- It aligns with **Active Travel and accessibility goals**, ensuring infrastructure is inclusive and safe for all users.

Note to the council I just wanted to confirm that you sent a representative out to visit my house on 24/07/2025 to inspect the wall damaged by a recent car accident on 16/06/2025 and that your representative felt that no action was required to make the wall safe to mitigate risk to passers by on the footpath.

I also wanted to raise a concern about speed control on the section of the Tubberjarlath/Dublin road outside my house. This is the third time in 10 years that my front wall has been knocked due to car accidents where speeding cars have lost control and collided with the wall, also posing a risk to human health and life. I would appreciate if some form of traffic speed control (e.g. speed bumps or speed cameras) would be put in place for this section of road as an urgency in light of this proven risk to public safety in the area, and to my home.

The person involved in the accident is still in a coma in Baumount hospital so no particulars of his insurance can be released.

It's only a matter of time before it is knocked again

As a parent living on the Upper Dublin Road in Tuam, I am deeply concerned about the ongoing danger faced by children and families walking to the GAA Sports Grounds, Tuam Rugby Club, and nearby schools. Heavy traffic and frequent speeding make this route extremely unsafe.

The current Active Travel Scheme from Vicar Street to the GAA Sports Grounds is a welcome step, but it stops short of the most dangerous stretch — from the GAA Grounds to the Tuam NCT Centre. This section includes residential areas, pre-school, and sports facilities used daily by children, parents, and elderly residents.

There are no safe pedestrian crossings or continuous footpaths in this area. The nearest crossing is over a kilometre away, forcing many to risk crossing through fast-moving traffic. My own children must cross this road to attend training sessions and local matches. Others use the facilities of Tuam Rugby club has a safe place to walk their dogs. It's frightening to see how close the near-misses have been.

Extending the Active Travel Scheme along the remaining built-up area of the Dublin Road would create a continuous, safe walkway linking the town centre to Toghermore Avenue. It would protect vulnerable pedestrians, reduce speeding through traffic calming, and encourage walking instead of short car trips.

This small but vital extension would make an enormous difference to families like mine. I urge Galway County Council to act now—before a serious accident happens—and complete this final section to make Tuam a safer, more connected town for everyone.

Proposal for Active Travel Scheme Extension

Current proposal: Tuam – Vicar Street to GAA Sports Grounds on R332 Dublin Road.

Extension proposal: Extend Active Travel Scheme along R332 Dublin Road to Tuam NCT Centre, completely covering built-up area speed limit zone.

We are a specialised preschool with the Brothers of Charity Services Ireland. We support children with an intellectual disability and additional needs such as physical, sensory and medical.

On behalf of the staff and families we support we welcome this proposal. However we have some safety concerns. An important part of our school programme is inclusion for children into the community. We visit our local amenities daily with the children (Mace supermarket and café and Glass Avenue). To access these we must cross a very busy road to get to the opposite footpath. There is a bend on the town side approaching our road and traffic tends to speed around it unaware people maybe crossing resulting in some near misses. Our children need time to safely cross using their mobility equipment. Staff need the security that traffic will travel at an acceptable speed and slow/stop if we are crossing.

Secondly turning into or out of the road is also dangerous due to the speed of traffic on the main road.

An extension of the Active Travel Scheme would provide the safe crossing points and traffic calming measures that in our opinion would address our safety concerns.

Proposal for Active Travel Scheme Extension

Current proposal: Tuam – Vicar Street to GAA Sports Grounds on R332 Dublin Road.

Extension proposal: Extend Active Travel Scheme along R332 Dublin Road to Tuam NCT Centre, completely covering built-up area speed limit zone.

We, the undersigned residents, parents, and community representatives of Tuam, warmly welcome the Active Travel Scheme and acknowledge the positive steps being taken to improve pedestrian access and road safety in our town. We respectfully request that the scheme be extended from the GAA Sports Grounds along the Dublin Road (R332) to cover the whole built-up area speed limit zone which begins at Tuam NCT Centre.

This short extension would link directly with the new footpath to Toghermore Avenue, developed in 2020, and would provide continuous, safe pedestrian access from the centre of town to the outskirts, greatly improving connectivity for all users.

For many years, as residents we have fought a campaign with Galway County Council for improved pedestrian safety on this section of the Dublin Road. Despite significant traffic volumes including heavy goods vehicles, the area currently lacks safe crossing points, continuous footpaths, and traffic calming measures.

The nearest pedestrian crossing is at Centra on the lower Dublin Road, approximately 1.1 km from Tuam NCT, while the current proposal creates a pedestrian crossing at Toberjarlath Road, 700 m from Tuam NCT. These crossings do not serve the large number of daily pedestrians accessing facilities in the Upper Dublin Road area.

The absence of safe pedestrian infrastructure affects a broad cross-section of the Tuam community, including:

- Residents of Garruan Park, Upper Dublin Road and Carrowpeter who rely on walking routes for daily access to shops, schools, and recreation.
- Students, teachers, and parents of Stepping Stones Child Development Centre in Garruan Park. This preschool caters to children aged 3–5 years with intellectual disabilities and additional physical and/or sensory needs. Many children use walkers or have limited mobility; a safe pedestrian crossing is essential for them to access nearby amenities safely. The students regularly take nature walks on Glass Avenue and visit the local Mace shop/café.
- Members of Tuam Rugby Football Club, Tuam Stars GAA Club, and Dynamo Blues Football Club, together with visiting teams and supporters, who regularly walk along this stretch of road to training and matches.

Hi Folks,

I would like to see an extension to the scheme other than its current format. The proposal in my view does not extend far enough to meet two other recently completed schemes.

Could I ask that the scheme be extended to meet the walking area recently completed at the High-Way Station (Elite Service Station/NCT Centre). This would link a walking route safely to Toghermore Campus, Ballymote Road, Gurraun Park (Tuam Rugby Club). It would also take in the Active Travel Scheme for Glass Avenue at the Rinkippen side which loops back to Athenry Road and on to Dublin road again at the junction (Archbishop McHale College).

A masterplan is in the process of being completed for the Toghermore Campus and lands currently owned by the HSE. It is envisaged that outcome will support the development of a community area of up to 22 acres. There is a safe walking route to here from the Service station on Upper Dublin Road. So the extension of the Active Travel Scheme would make sense to that area.

Just to add that there are concerns by local residents on speeding along some of this section of upper Dublin Road (that is not included) and it is important that we do everything possible to meet the needs of the local residents and create a safer route to promote walking and cycling.

In conclusion with other observations -

- Extension from Tuam Start GAA pitch to Glass Avenue to Tuam Rugby Club and on to the Service Station with both safe crossings and traffic calming measures to match.
- Make the area safe when turning onto and from Circular road for residents living there, especially on the corners.
- Insert railing or protective barriers to stop vehicles short cutting the corner and mounting the footpath.
- Create a setdown area dedicated to traffic that can be easily accessed by parents dropping off children to school.
- Re visit the pedestrian crossing at Supermacs to Town Hall and see if a Pelican Crossing is more friendly to users.
- Examine the possibility of a taxi rank spaces.
- Use only pelican crossings along the new route rather than traffic lights.
- Can there be room for dedicated bus set down for dropping school kids to complement the use of other areas used.
- Engage with schools to widen access off road for both drop offs and collections off the main road to align with what is being done on the road.
- Engage directly with all residents and businesses to ensure they are up to speed with works and are happy to proceed.
- engage with those who use parking permits that they won't lose any dedicated parking areas near their homes.

Theme: Extend the Active Travel Scheme to the NCT Centre, Vehicle Speeds & Pedestrian Crossings

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to express my concern regarding road safety along the R332, Dublin Road, Tuam, particularly in the vicinity of Toghermore Avenue, Tuam NCT Centre and Tuam Rugby Club. Please find attached photographs of the speed signs located on the town side of Toghermore Avenue and at the Tuam NCT

Centre. These images highlight instances of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds, with one photograph indicating a speed of 122 km/h in a 60 km/h zone. Several other photographs also document vehicles exceeding the posted speed limits.

The stretch of road between Toghermore Avenue and the Tuam Stars GAA Clubhouse presents a significant safety risk for both pedestrians and residents. This area is frequented by members and visitors of Tuam Stars GAA Club, Dynamo Blues Football Club, and Tuam Rugby Club, as well as individuals using the pathway to Toghermore Avenue. Unfortunately, the existing pathway along this road does not provide adequate safety for pedestrians or cyclists. The combination of high traffic speeds and the lack of pedestrian crossings makes it unsafe to walk or cycle to any of these facilities.

Additionally, the rejuvenation of High Way Garage—which now houses the Tuam NCT Centre, Delaney's Mace (our local shop), a hair salon, and a beauty salon—has resulted in a substantial increase in vehicular traffic and pedestrian footfall, especially on event days at the nearby sports clubs. Despite this increased usage, there remains no safe route for pedestrians travelling between High Way Garage and the three sports clubs, further underscoring the urgent need for traffic calming measures and safe pedestrian crossings.

In light of these concerns, I respectfully request that steps be taken to address the speeding issues and to improve pedestrian safety along this section of the R332. The installation of traffic calming measures and safe pedestrian crossings would greatly enhance safety for all road users.
