
Safe Routes to School Update

The Safe Routes to School (SRTS) programme is working with schools and local authorities across Ireland to support improvements to front of school environments as well as routes to school. Calasanctius College is delighted to be participating in the SRTS programme.

As part of the Safe Routes to School process, we previously shared the SRTS travel survey with parents/guardians to capture information on how students travel to school and on road safety issues around the school. The survey showed that:

- 74.4% of parents agree that road safety is a problem around the school,
- 94% of parents would support works at the front of school that improve student safety, putting pedestrians and cyclists first, and
- 95.2% of parents would support works that improve the walking and cycling routes to the school.

Have your Say!

Galway County Council is planning to undertake construction of measures at the front of school. The proposed works aim to alleviate congestion through modal shift and improve access at the front of school. The proposed scheme includes:

- Reinstatement and enhancement of bus bay and drop off facility adjacent to green space off Castle Road,
- Provision of a new crossing facility at the Castle Road junction with Main St.,
- Provision of raised uncontrolled crossings along Castle Road,
- Enhancements to footpaths, and
- Introduction of pencil bollards and Safe Routes to School signage.

As part of this, Galway County Council is hosting a public consultation to seek input on the scheme proposals. You can read more about the plans at https://consult.galway.ie/.
