
# Project Overview



represents a new approach to the development of our towns where local communities and local businesses can be central to re-imaging their own towns and planning their own futures.

## **Public Realm**

is defined as all outdoor areas in the town which are accessible to the public and will include the layout of the roads, pedestrian spaces, crossing points, parking, lighting, signage, street furniture, vegetation, art and more.

## What we are doing

Galway County Council has appointed BDP to prepare the Town Centre First and Public Realm Improvement Plan for Gort Town Centre. The decision making process will be informed by the Town Centre First Plan. This plan will be issued as part of the collaborative, information/data gathering process for the drafting of the Gort Local Area Plan, the Gort Traffic Management Plan, the Local Transport Plan, and the Walking and Cycling Strategy. The Gort Public Realm Improvement Project shall, by design, encourage visitors to explore the town by highlighting what it has to offer. The spaces developed should encourage social interaction, visitor dwell time, and be pleasant and enjoyable areas to spend time in.

## Program and Process

### January 2023

Site visits, engaging community, stakeholders and understanding Gort

#### **March 2023**

First ideas, testing options, agreeing general strategy and vision

#### **June 2023**

Formulating a draft Public Realm Improvement Plan design

### August/Sept. 2023

Completion and publication of the Town Centre First Plan

## What Happens Next

Autumn 2023 to Summer 2024 - Detailed Design for the Gort Public Realm Plan followed by a funding application.

Autumn 2024 - Go to tender to appoint a Contractor

January 2025 - Commence on site with an anticipated duration of 18 months









# Town Centre First


The following plans show how Gort town centre could be improved in line with the derived objectives and identified projects.



Area 1: Development Strategy Plan



- Introduce off-street car parking
- Ensure connection between off street car park and market square through use of pedestrian lane-ways
- Identify opportunity sites within back-lands



Area 2: Development Strategy Plan



- Identify opportunity sites within town centre back-lands
- Create alternative vehicle access route for back-land sites, re-directing large vehicle traffic off the core town centre streets
- Introduce footbridge to connect river walk and town centre




















Area 3: Development Strategy Plan

# Public Realm Plan



- Flexible open space for events, markets, etc.
- Garden space with small pocket spaces, new tree planting, ornamental planting and seating
- 03 One way 3.5m wide access road
- 04 Forecourts for outdoor terraces/seating and shop displays
- Drop-off area with on-street parking
- 06 Flexible use space: off-street parking or covered event space
- Signalised junction
- New pedestrian crossings
- Aspirational pedestrian link to Canon Quinn Park
- Pedestrian link to new proposed off-street car park
- New trees and planting throughout the square
- Sullivan's Hotel 'belvedere'

# Public Realm Plan



## Bridge Street:

- Relocated bus stops on each side of the bridge
- Tightened carriageway to 6.4m
- Rationalised on-street parking
- New pedestrian crossing
- Entrances to Town Park
- Aspirational continuation of Gort River Walk to connect it to Town Park
- **New Town Park**

## Georges Street:

- Tightened carriageway to 6.4m
- Parallel parking bays both sides of the street
- Green separators between parking pockets to break continuous parking
- New pedestrian crossing
- Forecourts along facades for terraces, shop displays, planting, pots, etc.
- Flexible planting strip separating the road from the pedestrian area
- New street trees
- Repaved drives





## Canon Quinn Park:

- 01 New entrance space, accessible to wheelchairs and prams
- Relocated mill stones at entrances
- Activity pocket Outdoor gym equipment
- Activity pocket Playground including natural play, boulders, stepping logs, etc.
- Activity pocket Informal modular seating / hang out area for teenagers
- Plinth or small stage for events in the park, possibly with cover
- Amphitheatre for events in the park
- Resurfaced and wider footpaths
- Biodiverse and low maintenance buffer planting
- New tree planting
- New aspirational pedestrian link from Market Square to Canon Quin Park
- Possible new access to Canon Quinn Park from pedestrian link











## 01 CYCLING




To include segregated cycle lanes would mean on-street parking would be significantly reduced or completely removed along major roads in the town. Therefore, proposing cycle lanes is infeasible. However, the measures proposed to reduce traffic speed will make it safer for cyclists. Cycle stands are to be incorporated into the town centre at appropriate locations.

## 02 SERVICING / LOADING



Provide accessible loading bays in required locations for shop and business.




Provide new improved lighting infrastructure in the town centre that meets current design standards. Opportunity areas for feature lighting and Christmas lights will be identified to enhance dark and under-utilised spaces. All lighting proposed will be appropriate to the existing setting.

## 04 EVENTS



Design spaces in the town to facilitate public events in various forms. These spaces include the market square and the secondary flexible events space with optional canopy shelter. Pedestrianised laneways and their adjacent opportunity sites may also facilitate smaller events.

## 05 TRANSPORT




Transport in the town will be enhanced to allow for a better relationship between pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles. The existing bus stop will be relocated closer to the train station.

## 06 PLAY AND RECREATION



More play and recreation spaces will be introduced as part of the proposals. Canon Quinn Park will see the introduction of new designated and informal play areas.

## 07 UNIVERSAL ACCESSIBILITY




Creating a public realm that provides a universal design. The enhancement scheme will provide a more comfortable public realm that serves the needs of all users and abilities. There will be wider footpaths and safer crossing points throughout.

## 08 VEGETATION / BIODIVERSITY




Introduce street trees and vegetation throughout the town centre. This will improve the local biodiversity and build upon on the existing Gort Area Biodiversity Plan 2021-2024.

## 09 ART / CULTURE



Create a town which celebrates art and culture by providing opportunities for new art peices and spaces for cultural activities to thrive.

## 10 PAVING



Propose a cohesive paving material palette to compliment the town centre facades and the new public realm design.

## 11 CONSERVATION AND HERITAGE



The public realm enhancements will look to conserve, complement, enhance, or reinstate heritage within the town centre.

## 12 WATER MANAGEMENT



Create sustainable urban drainage system, with the introduction of rain gardens along streets.


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## Public Realm Plan



Gort town centre is dominated by vehicles, both in terms of roads and parking.

In line with the aspirations of the public engagement process the balance between vehicles and pedestrians needs to be addressed. In order to introduce a new pedestrian space and reduce vehicle dominance, the parking layout needs to be reconsidered.


There are three types of parking needs identified:

- User 1: 15 minutes
- User 2: Under 2 hours
- User 3: Over 2 hours

#### The current situation:

- A large proportion of the vehicles parked within the square are there for more than 2 hours
- A large proportion of cars parked are not paying for parking
- There are no off-street car parks
- · The above results in low footfall and swell time spent in town centre.

## Proposed Parking Strategy:



The proposed parking strategy seeks to address the current situation and provide a much enhanced parking provision where different users park in the approapriate locations. The diagram below summarises the suggested changes:

- Introducion of free 15 minute on street parking bays at strategic locations to be agreed.
- Introduce new free off-street parking for long stay users (over 2 hours)
- Locate both loading bays and disabled bays in appropriate locations
- Provide a coach drop off location in the square along with off-street coach parking.
- Provide off-street Recreational Vehicle parking















# Wayfinding and Signage

Wayfinding is the tool we use to successfully interpret and navigate through an area or space. It is made up not just of signs, but also built forms, routes, the natural environment and of course human behaviour. To improve connectivity and town presentation, the plan proposes the following:



## 01 Welcome Arrival

The M18 junction: There could be a large 'welcome' element at the edges of the town; in particular at the start of the A458 main road from the motorway junction. This would announce Gort as destination and give awareness to the town's rich artistic components that awaits the visitor around the area. Example of possible arrival signage shown to the left.

## 02 Colourful Buildings at the Square





The Market Square: The main square in Gort is surrounded by buildings on all sides, and there is a predominant use of grey materials like stone, concrete, pebble dash and slate which creates a harsh, unwelcoming environment. Encouraging owners to paint their buildings a variety of bright colour would give an aesthetic lift, and create a pleasant, well-maintained destination.

## **04** Intuitive Directional

Walkways from the Town Square to proposed new car parks and the park. With the proposed addition of new car parking, the narrow walkways leading off the Square offer an opportunity to create and install bright, enhancing super graphics that intuitively lead visitors from the car park to the shops, without the need for any signage.
